The career planning timeline for AS, AAS or credit Technical Certificates is a “checklist” of some of the career planning tasks and activities you can engage in at Florida Community College. Please note that this plan is put together as a guide to assist you, it is not mandatory.

First Year

- ✓ Meet with a counselor or advisor to review general education and/or college preparatory course requirements and to receive contact information for your assigned program manager or program advisor.
- ✓ Become familiar with the resources and services available to you in the Career Development Center. Visit the web site at <http://www1.fccj.org/sjames/cdcsouth>.
- ✓ Consider a part-time job on campus related to your program of study. Visit the Student Employment unit located in the CDC to review job postings.
- ✓ Get involved on campus. A leadership role in a club or student organization will contribute to your personal development and help build your résumé. Visit the Student Activities office to find out about opportunities available to you.

Second Year

- ✓ Write a résumé and have it critiqued in the CDC. A résumé critique now can help you determine if there are “gaps” in your experience that you need to fill before graduating. Contact the CDC for résumé preparation assistance options.
- ✓ Practice your interviewing skills. Contact the CDC for interviewing assistance options.
- ✓ Begin seeking internship opportunities on your own, with your program manager, the internship coordinator assigned to your program area or with CDC assistance at least 6-8 months prior to the semester that you register for the internship credit class.
- ✓ Attend career fairs to network with employers.

AS, AAS, credit Tech. Cert. timeline con't:

- ✓ Get involved in professional organizations to help you with networking and possibly connect you with future career opportunities (e.g. the Jacksonville Chamber of Commerce offers a student membership). Contact the CDC for info.
- ✓ Research companies that you would like to work for.
- ✓ Register with the South Campus College Central Network site in order to search job openings and participate in the Résumé Referral Program. Résumé Referral will allow the CDC to release your resume to interested employers. Contact the CDC for information.

Last Year

- ✓ Remain abreast of on-campus recruitment opportunities. Visit the CDC for information.
- ✓ Select at least 3-5 references. (Give each one a copy of your résumé)
- ✓ Consider building an electronic portfolio to gain a competitive edge in the job market. (contact the CDC for info)
